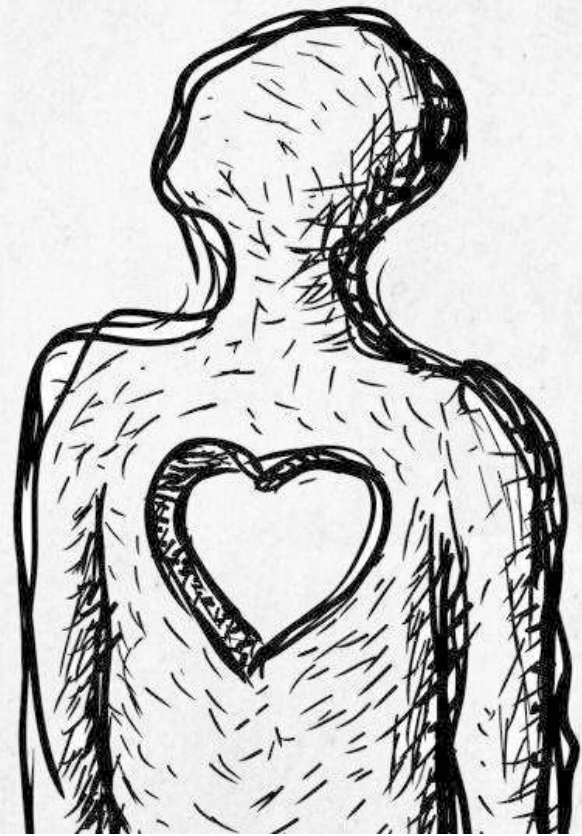
The world today is changing at such an accelerated rate where we as educators need to pause and reflect on this entire system of education. Gatik students are well equipped to face the challenges that the future holds.

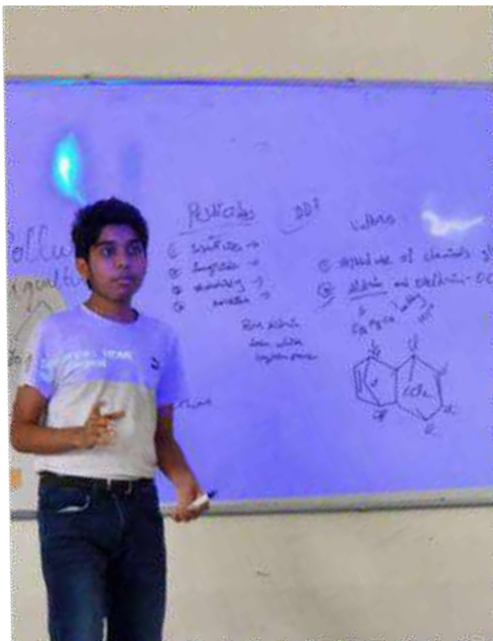

Found her standing in the doorway

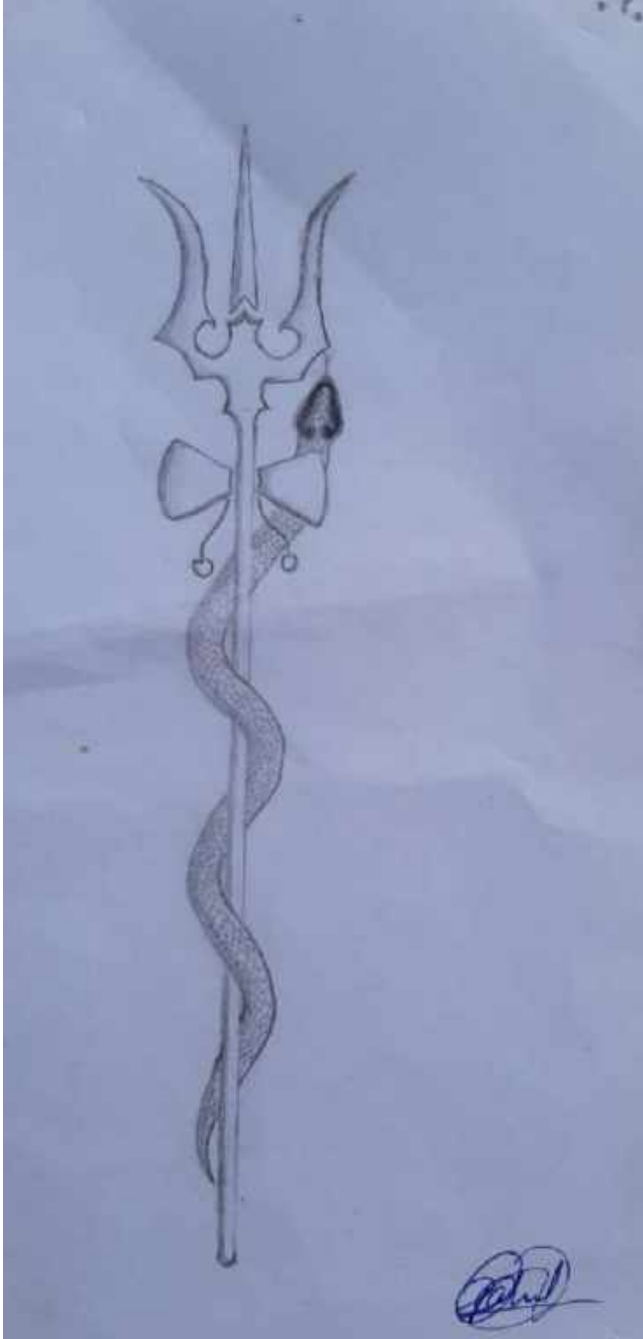

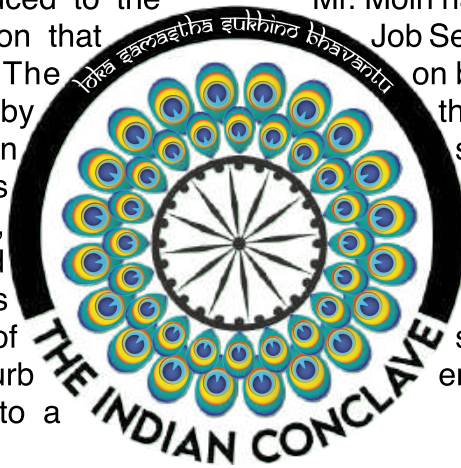


A Preface to The Indian Conclave

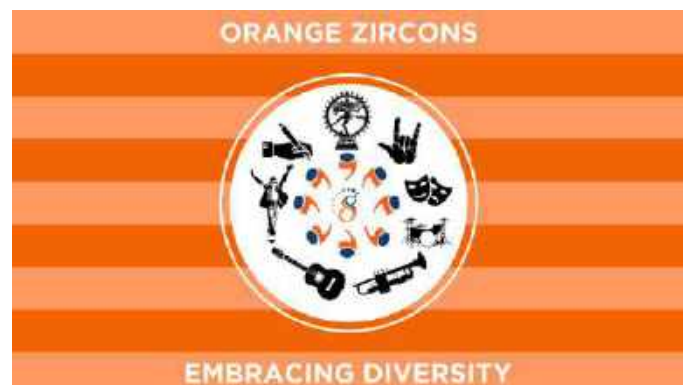

Life as it's known is too short, we preach to celebrate life and all its glory.



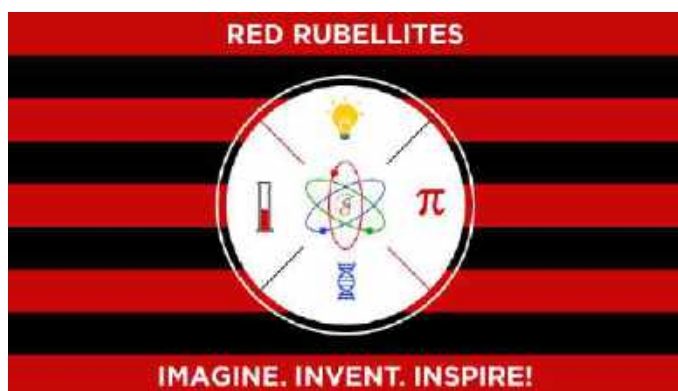

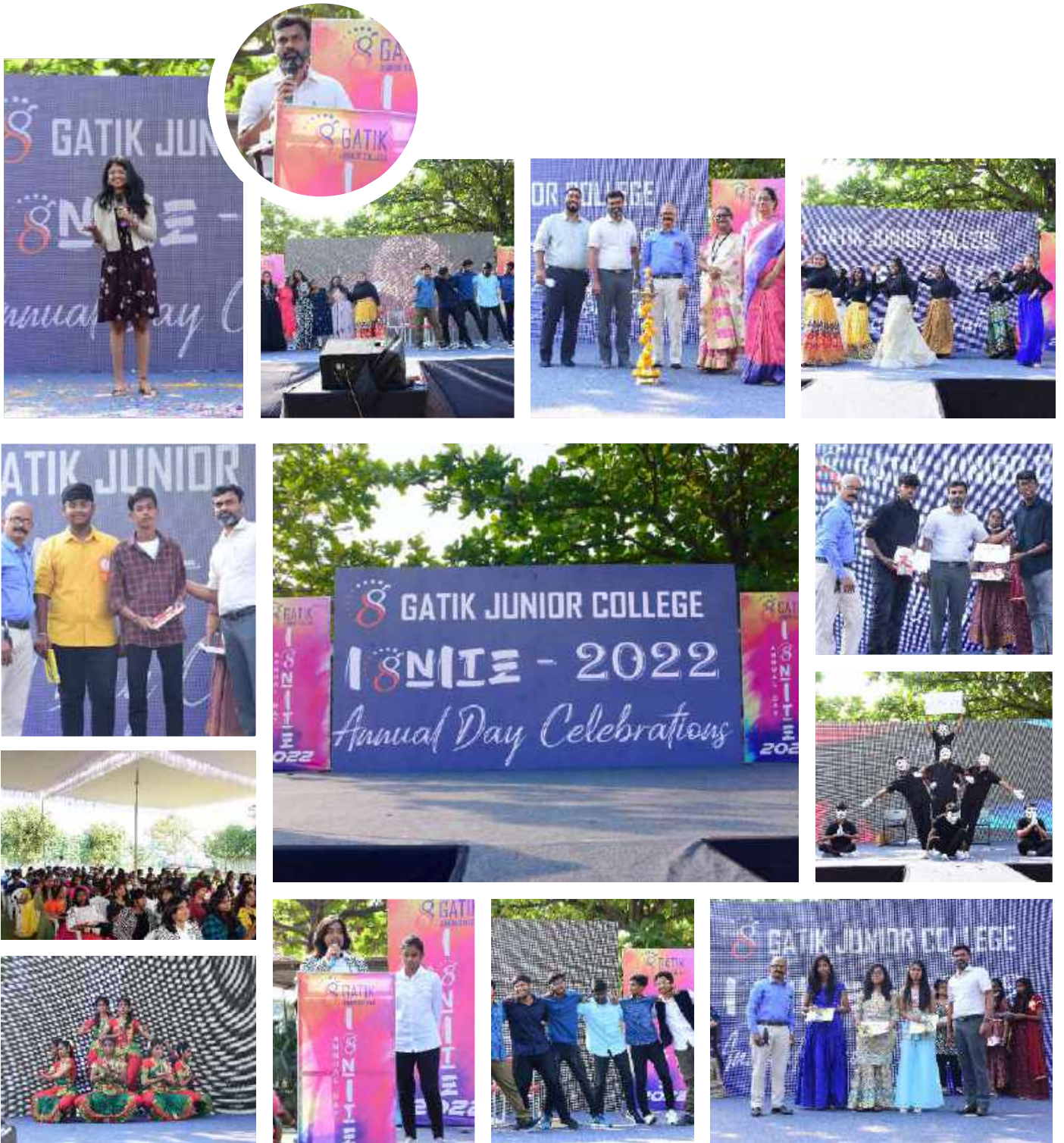

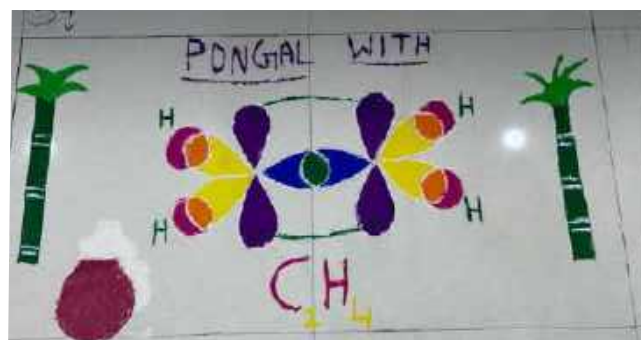
